TRAFFIC CONTROLLER

APPLICATION OF THE UNITS

Changes were introduced for the conduct of Traffic control courses in July 2015 where all training is now delivered under a unit of competency by a Registered Training Organisation. The Traffic Controller course is now made up of the following units of competency:

UNITS ADDRESSED IN TRAINING

RIIWH201D—Work Safely and Follow WHS Policies and Procedures

RIICOM201D—Communicate in the Workplace

RIIWH205D—Control Traffic with Stop-Slow Bat

DELIVERY OF TRAINING

If you are new to the industry, then you will be required to attend a training course conducted by an approved training provider (ATP). Once you have completed the face to face training course and met the training requirements, you will be issued a Statement of Completion (SOC) that is valid for 3 months. This SOC enables you to gain employment in an effort to complete your final workplace assessments. Only when you complete your on the job workplace assessments, can you be eligible for a NSW traffic control photocard. In cases of hardship or where for some reason this cannot happen within the 3 month timeframe, you will need to discuss this further with your training provider.

Assessments will include, theory questionnaires, on the job practical observations by assessors, and evidence gathering such as completing log books and other relevant evidence.
